

THE PALESTINIAN AUTHORITY'S PROPOSAL FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE TENET WORKPLAN

Introduction

The following timeline for implementing the elements in the Tenet Workplan is designed to return the situation on the ground to the condition that existed prior to September 28, 2000, including the annulment of all demographic and geographic changes and the revocation of all measures and steps in contradiction to signed agreements taken after September 28, 2000.

The implementation of this proposal will proceed in parallel with discussions in the Trilateral Senior Political Committee on the implementation of the remainder of the Mitchell Report's recommendations. The implementation of the remainder of the Mitchell Report's recommendations, including a complete freeze on all settlement activities, may begin at any time but no later than the completion of the timeline in this proposal on the date specified herein, as well as no later than the beginning of the third week of the beginning of the implementation of the timeline in this proposal.

The implementation of this proposal will also proceed in parallel with immediate discussions in the Trilateral Senior Political Committee on resumption of the permanent status negotiations dealing with all the permanent status issues (Jerusalem, borders, settlements, security, refugees, water, and other issues of common concern), which will lead to the implementation of UNSCR 242 and 338, preserving and building upon the prior negotiations that ended in Taba in January 2001. These negotiations shall be concluded no later than one year of their beginning.

After the withdrawal of all Israeli forces from all Areas A and other Palestinian territories under complete Palestinian jurisdiction in accordance with agreements signed, the following timeline will be implemented.

Preliminary Steps

The Israelis and the Palestinians will resume security meetings with each other and the United States and security cooperation. High ranking security officials will meet together under US auspices to agree upon a workplan for implementing the elements in Tenet. This proposal is presented as part of that process.

After the security officials in the above meeting agree to a workplan for the implementation of Tenet, the workplan will be submitted to the Trilateral Senior Political Committee for its adoption. Upon the adoption of the workplan, the Trilateral Senior Political Committee will adopt a joint declaration of ceasefire.

The government of Israel ("GOI") will lift all restrictions imposed on the freedom of movement of the Palestinian President.

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Continuous Obligations

Many of the obligations outlined above are of a continuous, ongoing nature that will continue to be implemented after the end of the above timeline. The dates specified above will be met as stated in parallel with the ongoing implementation of the continuous obligations.

International Monitoring and Verification

The Trilateral Senior Political Committee will establish an international monitoring and verification mission with the participation of the United States, the European Union, the Russian Federation, and the UN (the Quadrilateral Committee) in order to monitor and verify the implementation of the above-mentioned commitments and also the implementation of the Mitchell Report's recommendations, pursuant to Annex Three.

Parallel Trilateral Senior Political Committee Meetings

The above-mentioned steps will be enacted commensurate with ongoing meetings of the Trilateral Senior Political Committee that aim to identify the mechanisms for ending the Israeli occupation of the Palestinian territories based on the implementation of UNSCR 242 and 338, the Madrid terms of reference (and for peace), and the Taba understandings, and taking into account UNSCR 1397, President Bush' speech, and the Saudi Initiative.

The parties pledge that even if untoward events occur, security cooperation will continue through the Security Committee.
