REVIEW AND RECOMMENDATIONS

I. TRIAL DATA: The accused were tried at Dachau, Germany, during the period 9-10 January 1947, before an Intermediate Military Government Court.

II. CHARGES AND PARTICULARS:

FIRST CHARGE: Violation of the Laws and Usages of War.

PARTICULARS: In that Josef GLASHAUER, Max HAYNE, Wilhelm HERFF, Fritz Alois HRADILEK, Eduard JOREWITZ, Willi Kurt JOSIGER, Robert Heinrich Wilhelm KAEMPER, Anton Alexander KARCH, Wilhelm Andreas KELLER, Johannes KOCK, acting in pursuance of a common design to commit the acts hereinafter alleged, and as individuals aiding the operation of the Dachau Concentration Camp and camps subsidiary thereto, did, at or in the vicinity of DACHAU and LANDSBERG, Germany, between about 1 January 1942 and about 29 April 1945, wilfully, deliberately and wrongfully participate in the subjection of civilian nationals of nations then at war with the then German Reich to cruelties and mistreatment, the exact names and numbers of such civilian nationals being unknown but aggregating many thousands who were then and there in the custody of the then German Reich in exercise of belligerent control.

SECOND CHARGE: Violation of the Laws and Usages of War.

PARTICULARS: In that Josef GLASHAUER, Max HAYNE, Wilhelm HERFF, Fritz Alois HRADILEK, Eduard JOREWITZ, Willi Kurt JOSIGER, Robert Heinrich Wilhelm KAEMPER, Anton Alexander KARCH, Wilhelm Andreas KELLER, Johannes KOCK, acting in pursuance of a common design to commit the acts hereinafter alleged, and as individuals aiding in the operation of the Dachau Concentration Camp, did, at or in the vicinity of DACHAU, Germany, between about 1 January 1942 and about 29 April 1945, wilfully, deliberately and wrongfully participate in the subjection of members of the armed forces of nations then at war with the then German Reich, who were then and there surrendered and unaged prisoners of war in the custody of the then German Reich, to cruelties and mistreatment, the exact names and numbers of such prisoners of war being unknown but aggregating many hundreds.

III. DATA AS TO ACCUSED:

1. JOSEF GLASHAUER (Correct spelling GLASHAUSER, R 46, 47)
This accused was acquitted (R 107).
2. MAX HAYNE
This accused was acquitted (R 107).
3. WILHELM HEREF
This accused was acquitted (R 107).
4. FRITZ ALOIS HRADILEK
A nolle prosequi was entered in favor of this accused (R 2).
5. EDUARD JOREWITZ
This accused was acquitted (R 107).
6. WILLI KURT JOSIGER
This accused was acquitted (R 107).
7. ROBERT HEINRICH WILHELM KAEMPER
This accused was acquitted (R 108).
8. ANTON ALEXANDER KARCH
This accused was acquitted (R 108).
9. WILHELM ANDREAS KELLER
This accused was acquitted (R 108).
10. JOHANNES KOCK
This accused was acquitted (R 108).

IV. SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE:

By their own admissions, all of the accused were members of the SS and stationed at Dachau Concentration Camp or its outcamps for considerable periods of time. Prosecution's P-Ex 1 is a certified copy of the charges, particulars, findings and sentences in the parent Dachau Concentration Camp Case (U.S. v. Weiss et al., 000-50-2, March 1946; R 11). The Court apparently concluded that the evidence concerning the nature and extent of their participation in the mass atrocity operation was inadequate to form a proper basis for sentencing the accused.

V. JURISDICTION:

It is clear that the Court had jurisdiction of the persons of the ac-
