MEVIEW AND GECOMMENDATIONS

I. Tilal DATA: The accused were tried at Dachau, Germany, during the period 11-13 August 1947, before a General Military Government Court.

II. CHARGE AND PARTICULARS:

OHLUGA: Violation of the Laws and Usages of War.

Particulars: In that andolf DIMMAGEL, Kart Madrill, and Hans Piatson iid, at or near Manich, Cormany, in or about July or august 1944, wrongfully encourage, aid, abot and participate in the killing of five unknown nembers of the United States Army, who were then and there surrendered and unarmed prisoners of war in the custody of the then German Reich.

III. DATA AS TO AGGUSTED:

1. Aplolf DINAGEL

This accused was acquitted (h 155).

2. Aurt wilholm KakTIN

This accused was acquitted (R 124).

3. Hans PIETSCH

This accused was neither served nor tried (R 1).

IV. SURMANY OF EVIDENCE: In July, August or Soptomber 1944, following an air raid over Munich, five or six Americans bailed out of
their disabled bender and were captured (R 67; P-Ex 8). After being
interrogated by accused DLAMAGEL, commanding officer of the SS flak
training regiment, they were supposedly turned ever to one Captain
Loosehmieck, commanding officer of the first battalien, with the understanding that the prisoners would be taken to air force headquarters
at Schleissheim (R 129, 130). The incident may have occurred in
October 1944 (R 34; P-Ex 11) or there may have been two incidents (R 66;

P-Ex 7). The bodies of two Americans were found in a bomb erator near the airport (# 46) on or about 6 March 1945, and autopsies were performed by one Professor Holzer (# 49). The cause of death in each case was given as gunshet wound of the neck (# 50, P-Exs 12, 13). There was virtually no evidence against the accused MARTIN who was acquitted (# 124) on motion of the prosecutor (# 123)

The Court had jurisdiction of the persons of the scused and of the subject matter.

V. CONCLUSIONS:

It is recommended that the record of trial be filed in the records of this effice and that a copy of this moview and Recommendations be forwarded to the Judge Advocate, European Command, for his information.
