2. EVIDENCE:

For the Prosecution. It was shown that during the month of August 1943 a fatally wounded American pilot believed to be Robert KAY landed near Epplingen, Germany (R 8, 9). A fifteen year old German youth, Hubert WILLIG, testified that the accused HOPMUNN and HETTINGER kicked the dying flyer in the head as he lay on the ground (R 10, 11). The flyer was placed in a cart and taken to rooms of the home guard where he died shortly thereafter (R 12). The flyer was an American (R 8, 88).

For the Defense. Accused testified in their defense; denied king or mistreating the flyer (R 26 to 38). Karl MENNINGER (R 38), Joseph KNOEKZER (R 47), Adolph FLEUCHHAUSE (R 60), Julius STOCK (R 66), Hedwig HOFMA (R 71), Magdalene FRIEDRICH (R 74), Edward MEBER (R 77) and Dr. Gustav WITTHLEY (R 83) corroborated their testimony.

3. CONCLUSIONS: The findings of the court of not guilty are amply sustained by the evidence. No formal approval is required. It is recommended that the record of trial and this Review and Recommendations be filed without further action and that a copy hereof be forwarded to the Theater Judge advocate for his information.
