REVIEW AND RECOMMENDATIONS

I. TRIAL DATA: The accused was tried at Dachau, Germany, 12 June 1947, before a General Military Government Court.

II. CHARGE AND PARTICULARS:

CHARGE: Violation of the Laws and Usages of War.

Particulars: In that Paul SCHULT, a German national, did, on or about 9 March 1945, at or near DARMSTADT, Germany, wrongfully encourage, aid, abet and participate in committing assaults upon a member of the United States Army, Sgt. John A. STAR, who was then and there a surrendered and unarmed prisoner of war in the custody of the then German Reich.

III. DATA AS TO ACCUSED:

1. Paul SCHULT

This accused was acquitted (R 61).

IV. SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE: On or about 9 March 1945 an American flyer, Sergeant John A. Star, landed in a forest near Darmstadt, Germany (P-Ex 2). He was captured by two policemen and conducted to police headquarters and there delivered to accused SCHULT, the police captain in charge (R 7). An angry crowd of policemen gathered in the corridor shouting "Beat him dead", "shoot the murderer" and "bump him off" (R 5; P-Exs 4, 5). The accused searched the flyer (P-Ex 3) and then, speaking in German, ordered the flyer to remove the chewing gum from his mouth (P-Exs 3, 5). As Star did not understand, he continued to chew, which infuriated the accused (P-Ex 3). Accused kicked at the flyer (R 7, P-Exs 3, 4, 5). The evidence was conflicting as to whether the accused's foot actually struck the flyer. The accused denied mistreat-
