



**Report to Congress on
Voting Practices in the United Nations for 2024
Public Law 101-246 31**

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INTRODUCTION

The Report to Congress on Voting Practices in the United Nations was first published in 1984, for the year 1983 pursuant to Public Law 98-151 and Public Law 98-164. This year's report is submitted in accordance with section 406 of the Foreign Relations Authorization Act, Fiscal Years 1990 and 1991 [Public Law 101-246 (22 U.S.C. §2414a)].

The UN Security Council (UNSC) and the UN General Assembly (UNGA) address threats to international peace and security, disarmament, development, humanitarian relief, human rights, the environment, and narcotics — all of which directly affect priority U.S. interests. This report reviews voting practices in the UNSC and the UNGA in calendar year 2024, covering parts of General Assembly Sessions 78 and 79 (GA sessions begin in mid-September), as well as the resumed 10th Emergency Special Session of the General Assembly, presenting data in a variety of formats. The report summarizes the actions of the UNGA and the UNSC (Section I). All UN Security Council resolutions and votes for the calendar year are described and tabulated (Section II). The report measures the overall voting coincidence of UN Member States at the General Assembly in comparison with the U.S. voting record (Section III). It also lists and describes UNGA resolutions selected as particularly important to U.S. interests (Section IV). The report then presents voting patterns on General Assembly resolutions relating to Israel (Section V) and Ukraine (Section VI). Finally, the report includes a side-by-side analysis for every country according to their respective UN regional grouping (Section VII).

Voting coincidence: The UN acts on a diverse set of issues; therefore, the voting record of a UN member in the General Assembly and Security Council provides insight into a country's orientation toward a wide range of topics of importance to the United States. The voting coincidence¹ data in this report is drawn only from UN General Assembly and Security Council votes. It does not indicate the coincidence of support for U.S. policies in other bodies in the UN System, other multilateral fora, or in bilateral contexts. Most bodies in the UN system adopt resolutions by consensus without votes being taken, which may skew the data for issues that enjoy wide consensus. Approximately 72 percent of all General Assembly resolutions, however, are adopted by acclamation. Therefore, overall voting correlation between countries is dependent on the types of resolutions that come to a vote. For example, Israel-related resolutions account for approximately 16

percent of resolutions that were adopted with a vote, significantly affecting the voting coincidence for countries that oppose these resolutions. While it is difficult to infer specific positions from resolutions adopted by consensus, it suggests insights into areas of general agreement among Member States of the UN. For this reason, the report also provides limited information on how these resolutions figure into voting coincidence.

¹ Voting coincidence provides the “comparison of the overall voting practices in the principal bodies of the United Nations” as requested by Congress.

¹ In previous versions of this report, these preliminary votes were combined with final plenary votes in calculating voting coincidence. This practice had the effect of distorting the overall voting coincidence. This distortion stemmed from the repetitive nature of preliminary votes, which may or may not correspond with a Member State’s ultimate position on the final plenary vote and inadvertently multiply the relative significance of these resolutions on the voting coincidence metric by the number of paragraph votes.

SUMMARY: UN GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Overall Voting Coincidence: The average voting coincidence for contested resolutions (i.e., requiring a roll call vote, instead of being adopted by consensus without a vote) between the United States and the other 192 countries in the UN General Assembly was 46 percent for 2024, the same as 2023, and higher than the 20-year average of 35 percent.

In 2024, Israel had the highest voting coincidence with the United States (89 percent), and Nicaragua had the lowest (21 percent). The eight countries with the highest voting coincidence with the United States were (in descending order): Israel, Argentina, Hungary, United Kingdom, Czechia, Micronesia, Canada, and Lithuania. Five countries tied for the ninth highest voting coincidence with the United States: Germany, France, Albania, Ukraine, and Australia each had 72 percent voting coincidence. The nine countries with the lowest voting coincidence with the United States were (in ascending order) Nicaragua, DPRK, Iran, Mali, Syria, Cuba, Belarus, the Russian Federation, and Sudan. Six countries tied for the 10th lowest voting coincidence with the United States: Eritrea, Algeria, Burundi, Bolivia, Turkmenistan, and Niger.

Contested: Of the 342 UNGA resolutions adopted in 2024, 95 draft resolutions (28 percent) were contested and required a vote, compared to 88 contested draft resolutions (26 percent) during 2023. The number of roll call votes on UNGA resolutions is higher than in other UN bodies, where typical practice is for resolutions to be adopted by consensus.

U.S. Opposition: In 2024, the United States voted against 54 percent of voted UNGA resolutions, the most of any other UN Member State besides Israel. Israel voted against 57 percent of voted UNGA resolutions in 2024. UN Member States voted against eight percent of resolutions in 2024 on average. Israel voted against the most resolutions in 2023 (59 percent) and in 2022 (53 percent).

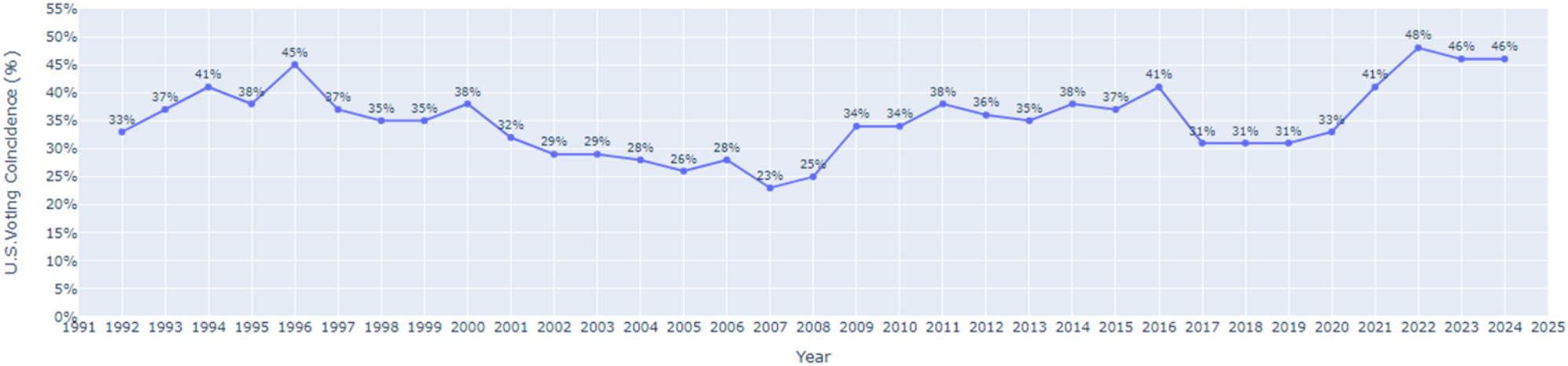
U.S. Isolation: The United States never voted in full isolation in any vote in 2024. The United States voted in near isolation on six votes, joined solely by Israel. Those six resolutions were related to the 1925 Geneva

Protocol, Cuba, Lebanon, and issues of self-governance.

Non-votes and Abstentions: The average non-vote/absentee rate for all Member States was eight percent of votes in 2024, a slight decrease from 9 percent in 2023. The countries with the most absences were Venezuela and Afghanistan, which were not permitted to vote due to being in arrears in their payments to the UN. Sixty-six Member States were present for all 95 votes, not including the United States, which was absent for one vote. In 2024, 12 percent of all recorded votes by all Member States in the General Assembly were abstentions. The United States abstained on 12 percent of voted resolutions (11 votes).

SUMMARY: UN SECURITY COUNCIL

In 2024, in addition to the five permanent UNSC members – France, China, the Russian Federation, the United Kingdom, and the United States – the UN Security Council (UNSC) was comprised of the following non-permanent members: Algeria, Ecuador, Guyana, Japan, Malta, Mozambique, Sierra Leone, Slovenia, Republic of Korea, and Switzerland. During 2024, the Security Council held 305 public and private meetings, adopted 46 resolutions, and issued seven presidential statements. The Security Council considered 45 agenda items.

In addition to regular meetings, the Security Council held 124 informal consultations, nine of which were held with troop- and police-contributing countries (TCCs/PCCs). The top three topics discussed were: The Middle East, including the Palestinian question; Yemen; and Sudan.

VOTING COINCIDENCE

There were 54 votes in the UNSC during 2024, with the Council adopting a total of 46 resolutions. The Council adopted 30 resolutions unanimously and 24 resolutions were either contested, featured abstentions, and/or were not adopted due to either vote count (a minimum of nine votes in favor is required for adoption) or a veto. Seven did not pass due to vetoes. The United States voted in favor of 48 draft resolutions, abstained on two, and voted against four. Of the four draft resolutions that the United States voted against, three were considered vetoes while one did not have sufficient votes to pass.

FORMAT AND METHODOLOGY

The format and presentation of this report are consistent with provisions in Public Law 101-246. The methodology includes calculations on abstentions and non-votes, and this report gives non-votes the same value as abstentions. The methodology also emphasizes the votes taken on final resolutions over those taken on preliminary texts, and it is intended to capture more accurately the voting conduct of UN Member States. The tables in this report reflect country “voting coincidence” with the United States based on all recorded final plenary votes in either the UN General Assembly or Security Council. This computation excludes resolutions approved by consensus (without a vote), procedural motions, preliminary votes, or votes on which either the United States or the country with which it is being compared did not cast a vote (absentee). To provide additional context, the report also includes an additional percentage on voting coincidence for all resolutions adopted by the General Assembly, whether by vote or by consensus, to indicate the range of issues on which common agreement exists. This figure is denoted in charts in the final section of the report under the heading “Voting Coincidence: Roll Call and Consensus.”

The **methodology** for calculating the “voting coincidence” compares how the United States and the listed country voted. Votes are placed into one of four categories: same; opposite; partial; and absent.

- **“Same”** is the total number of times the United States and the listed country voted together, with each vote counting as one (1) point.
- **“Opposite”** is the total number of times the United States and the listed country voted counter to each other; each vote counts as zero (0) points.
- **“Partial”** is the number of times the United States and the listed country were partially aligned (one country, but not both, abstained on a resolution), each vote is a half point (0.5).
- **“Absent”** is the number of times the listed country did not vote. Each absent vote is calculated as a half point (0.5).

Voting Coincidence with the United States is calculated by adding the points, and the total is divided by the total number of votes. For resolutions adopted by acclamation, the vote of every country is assigned “same” and calculated accordingly.

Final plenary votes are decisions on full resolutions, and in this report correspond to the resolutions adopted “with a vote.” Preliminary votes are decisions on an operative or preambular paragraph of a resolution.

Resolutions can sometimes feature as many as a dozen paragraph votes. Such votes are taken in advance of the final plenary action.² The voting coincidence methodology on contested resolutions in this report only measures a country’s final position on a resolution against the final position of the United States. There were 95 roll call votes in the UN General Assembly in 2024, higher than the 88 roll call votes in 2023 and higher than the 89 in 2022.

Abstentions (“abstain” votes) are included in coincidence metrics for a more comprehensive review and to better measure the shifting support of countries. Solitary abstentions are provided in a new column titled “partial,” identifying either the select country or the United States as having abstained on a vote. While reports prior to 2017 ignored abstentions, counting single abstentions with a half-point provides more nuance to the voting coincidence metric. Convincing a country to shift its vote from opposite the U.S. position can take significant effort or involve significant political cost if the country is breaking the consensus position in a regional group or ideological voting bloc. Convincing a country to abstain can be an incremental step toward an eventual reversal or, depending on the overall votes, be a successful or useful outcome in itself.

Non-votes/Absences are now included in voting coincidence calculations since a country’s absence

can often be political (purposely not attending) as much as situational (unable to attend or is in arrears to the UN). Like abstentions, persuading a country to consciously not vote rather than oppose a U.S. position also takes significant effort and often provides a pathway for countries to act without alienating a regional or ideological voting bloc. Consequently, non-votes are scored as abstentions. Non-vote/Absentee counts are provided separately in the “absent” column.

In 2024, a few countries were absent for all votes on Israel-related or “important” issues (defined below), or both. A country’s absence may also be apolitical. Countries may be absent due to their mission to the UN’s lack of capacity. In a few cases, countries have been barred from voting due to being in arrears in payments to the UN. In keeping with this report’s methodology, these countries are given the same value as abstain, but their true voting alignment with the United States remains unknown.

In 2024, five countries were absent for more than 50 percent of UNGA votes.

Consensus resolutions have been excluded (since 1984) from the main voting coincidence metrics, except for in the charts under the final section of the report under the column “Voting Coincidence Roll Call and Consensus.” Resolutions adopted by recorded vote address issues of contention more explicitly and are more revealing about whether countries support U.S. positions or oppose them,

which is why they were the original focus of the 1984 report. Because the UNGA adopts between 70 and 80 percent of its resolutions by acclamation, excluding assessment of consensus resolutions oversimplifies the measure of opposition to U.S. positions, and understates areas of general agreement. Thus, this report follows the existing methodology of previous reports, but also includes an additional general figure for overall coincidence as well (see charts pages 110-125.) In 2024, there were 247 consensus resolutions in the UN General Assembly, a slight decrease from the 250 in 2023 and a slight increase from the 246 in 2022.

Important issues are defined in the U.S. Department of State's annual U.S. Congressional Report on "Voting Practices in the United Nations" and by Public Law 101-246 which calls for, with respect to plenary votes for the UN General Assembly, a listing of "votes on issues which directly affected important United States interests and on which the United States lobbied extensively." An essential basis for identifying "important" issues is their alignment with the State Department's Strategic Goals.

Israel-related issues are captured in resolutions that specifically mention Israel by name. These standing General Assembly resolutions remain largely consistent from year to year, with an average of a dozen one-sided, biased resolutions focused on Israel and Israeli behavior (compared to a similar number of country-specific resolutions for the rest of the world combined).

Ukraine-related issues are identified by any resolution specific to the ongoing war in Ukraine.

COUNTRY NAMES

This report uses official United Nations membership country names since this report is based on United Nations data and requires ability to cross reference this report with official voting records from the United Nations. Due to page formatting limits, some tables may use short form or officially assigned International Organization for Standardization (ISO) 3166-1 alpha-3 codes. The use of any country’s name in this report does not represent official recognition by the United States or indicate any shift in U.S. policy.

SECURITY COUNCIL

In 2024, the Security Council held 305 public and private meetings and considered 54 draft resolutions, adopting 46 whereas seven were vetoed. Of the 54 votes on draft resolutions, the United States voted in favor of 48, voted against three, and abstained on two; one draft resolution did not have enough votes in favor to pass which the United States also voted against. The Russian Federation vetoed four of the failed resolutions and China joined the Russian Federation in one of these vetoes. France and the United Kingdom did not exercise their vetoes. The United States vetoed three resolutions. The table on page 33 lists the resolutions of the UN Security Council and voting outcomes.

UNSC SIGNIFICANT OUTCOMES

REGIONAL

Afghanistan

- **Resolution 2727** (March 15): The Council unanimously reauthorized the UN Assistance Mission to Afghanistan (UNAMA) mandate to March 2025.

Central African Republic (CAR)

- **Resolution 2745** (July 30): The Council unanimously adopted the CAR sanctions renewal resolution, which instituted a narrower arms embargo focused on armed groups operating in CAR. It also extended for one year the Panel of Experts' mandate and renewed existing travel ban and asset freeze measures.

Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC)

- **Resolution 2738** (June 27): The Council unanimously renewed the DRC sanctions regime, extending the Group of Experts' mandate and arms embargo, travel ban, and asset freeze measures until July 1, 2025.

Haiti

- **Resolution 2743** (July 12): The Council unanimously extended the United Nations Integrated Office in Haiti (BINUH) mandate for a year until July 2025. The text requested all Haitian stakeholders urgently to establish a Provisional Electoral Council and reach an agreement on a sustainable, time-bound, and commonly accepted road map for elections.

Iraq

- **Resolution 2732** (May 31): The Security Council unanimously extended the UN Assistance Mission for Iraq's (UNAMI) mandate for a final 19-month drawdown period until the end of 2025, after which UNAMI would cease all operations except any remaining liquidation.

Israeli/Palestinian Conflict

- The United States vetoed several UNSC products on this file, including resolutions on the situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question (**S/2024/173** – February 20 and **S/2024/835** – November 20), and the admission of new members, State of Palestine (**S/2024/312** – April 18).
- **Resolution 2728** (March 25): The United States abstained from this resolution, which called for a ceasefire during Ramadan, because of its failure to condemn Hamas, although it passed with 14 votes in favor.
- **Resolution 2735** (June 10): The U.S.-drafted resolution called on Hamas to accept a three-phase ceasefire and hostage release deal to end the fighting in Gaza. Fourteen members voted in favor and the Russian Federation abstained.

Libya

- **Resolution 2755** (October 31): The Security Council unanimously renewed the UN Support Mission in Libya (UNSMIL) mandate until January 31, 2025 with an automatic nine-month extension pending appointment of a new Special Representative and Mission Head.

Somalia

- **Resolution 2753** (October 30): The Security Council unanimously authorized a two-year phased closure of the UN Assistance Mission in Somalia (UNSOM) by October 2026, in line with a request by Somalia. During the transition, UNSOM was renamed as the UN Transitional Assistance Mission in Somalia (UNTMIS) to phase out some tasks and transfer residual tasks to the UN Country Team in Somalia.
- **Resolution 2762** (December 13): The Security Council extended the maritime interdiction of charcoal, weapons or military equipment, and IED components in Somalia until February 28, 2025. The resolution also extended the mandate of the Panel of Experts until March 31, 2025.

- **Resolution 2767** (December 27): The Security Council authorized the African Union Support and Stabilization Mission in Somalia (AUSSOM) to replace the African Union Transition Mission in Somalia (ATMIS) which expired on December 31, 2024. The resolution passed with 14 votes in favor and an abstention by the United States. The resolution requested the Secretary-General to implement a hybrid framework of a funding mechanism established by resolution 2719 (2023), if the Security Council took an affirmative decision to do so by May 15, 2025.

South Sudan

- **Resolution 2731** (May 30): The Security Council adopted a resolution that preserved and extended the arms embargo, travel ban, and asset freeze measures in South Sudan for an additional 12 months.

Sudan

- **Resolution 2724** (March 8): This resolution called for an immediate ceasefire during the Muslim holy month of Ramadan and for all warring parties to seek a sustainable resolution to the conflict through dialogue. It was adopted with 14 votes in favor and one abstention from the Russian Federation.
- **Resolution 2725** (March 8): This resolution extended the mandate of the Panel of Experts assisting the 1591 Sudan Sanctions Committee until March 12, 2025. It was adopted with 13 votes in favor and two abstentions from China and the Russian Federation.
- **Resolution 2736** (June 13): This resolution demanded that the Rapid Support Forces (RSF) halt the siege of El Fasher, the capital of North Darfur state, and further called for an immediate halt to the fighting and for de-escalation in and around El-Fasher. It was adopted with 14 votes in favor and one abstention from the Russian Federation.
- **Resolution 2750** (September 11): The Security Council unanimously adopted a resolution renewing the 1591 Sudan sanctions regime, which includes targeted sanctions (assets freezes and travel bans) and an arms embargo, until September 12, 2025.
- **S/2024/826** (November 18): The Russian Federation vetoed a draft resolution, which urged an immediate ceasefire, called on the warring parties to initiate a dialogue on a national ceasefire, and called for the protection of civilians. The remaining 14 Council members voted in favor of the resolution.

Yemen

- **Resolution 2722** (January 10): This resolution demanded the Houthis immediately cease attacks on commercial and merchant vessels in the Red Sea and was adopted by eleven votes in favor, with four abstentions from the Russian Federation, Algeria, Mozambique, and China. Russian amendments were defeated, which would have removed Member States' right to defend vessels and linked Houthi attacks in the Red Sea to the conflict between Israel and Hamas.
- **Resolution 2758** (November 13): The Security Council unanimously adopted a resolution renewing the 2140 sanctions regime which included targeted sanctions (assets freezes and travel bans) and an arms embargo, until November 15, 2025. The resolution also extended the mandate of the Panel of Experts on Yemen until December 15, 2025.

THEMATIC

Children and Armed Conflict

- **Resolution 2764** (December 20): This resolution highlighted the need to facilitate adequate and sustainable child protection capacities in UN peace operations, including in the context of transitions to or from UN missions. The text was adopted unanimously and co-sponsored by 111 Member States.

Sanctions and Counterterrorism

- **Resolution 2744** (July 19): The Council unanimously adopted this resolution, which enhanced the UN Focal Point mechanism's due process, fairness, and transparency for delisting requests and established an informal working group to discuss cross-cutting UN sanctions issues. The resolution also garnered over 50 cosponsors.
- **Resolution 2761** (December 6): The Council unanimously adopted the resolution, which indefinitely extended the humanitarian carveout to the UN 1267 ISIL and Al-Qaida sanctions regime pursuant to resolution 2664 (2022).

Weapons of Mass Destruction in Outer Space

- **S/2024/302** (April 24): The Russian Federation vetoed a draft resolution that would have been the

Security Council’s first-ever resolution on outer space. The vetoed text reaffirmed the shared goal of all States on preventing an arms race in outer space and urged exploration and use of outer space for peaceful purposes.

- **S/2024/383** (May 20): Following the Russian Federation’s veto of S/2024/302, it circulated its own resolution. That resolution failed to pass due to insufficient support in the Security Council, with seven voting in favor, seven against, and one abstention.

UNSC Vetoes: The United States exercised three vetoes in 2024 on resolutions regarding the situation in the Middle East and the admission of new members to the United Nations, including the “State of Palestine.” The Russian Federation exercised four vetoes on resolutions regarding the situation in the Middle East, non-proliferation, and reports of the Secretary-General on Sudan and South Sudan. China exercised one veto in concert with Russian Federation on the same resolution regarding the situation in the Middle East. The United Kingdom and France exercised no vetoes.

2024 Voting Coincidence with the United States on Security Council Votes

The following table summarizes UN Member State voting coincidence with the United States for the 54 votes in 2024, sorted from highest to lowest. The methodology for obtaining the figures is in Section I. Voting coincidence in the UNSC is significantly and consistently higher than in the UNGA, due to the risk of a veto by

a permanent member (i.e., P5), which requires Member States to thoroughly negotiate compromise language to secure adoption. This level of compromise is not required in the UNGA due to the one-country one-vote system and lack of a veto.

GENERAL ASSEMBLY: IMPORTANT ACTIONS

Public Law 101-246 calls for a listing of important UN General Assembly (UNGA) votes, defined as “votes on issues which directly affected important United States interests and on which the United States lobbied extensively.” An important basis for identifying issues is their alignment with the State Department’s Strategic Goals. For 2024, twenty-nine resolutions were identified for inclusion in this section; ten of these resolutions were adopted without a vote because the United States was able to achieve consensus language through lobbying and engagement. The General Assembly adopted the remaining 19 with a vote. Of these 19 important resolutions, the United States voted in favor of ten, opposed eight, abstained once, and missed no votes. The following resolutions are identified by a short title, resolution number, vote tally (Yes-No-Abstain or “without a vote”), and how the United States voted. Below is a summary analysis of the important elements of the identified resolutions, grouped by general category.

UKRAINE: The United States supported an important resolution in condemnation of Russia’s full-scale invasion of Ukraine:

- Safety and Security of Nuclear Facilities of Ukraine, Including the Zaporizhzhia Nuclear Power Plant **(A/RES/78/316)**

GENERAL ASSEMBLY: ISRAEL-RELATED ACTIONS

Public Law 101-246, as amended by Public Law 108-447, calls for a listing of all General Assembly plenary votes cast on resolutions specifically related to Israel. This section includes:

- 1) a listing of Israel-related votes; and
- 2) voting coincidence percentages with the United States. The annual resolutions condemning Israel are repetitive, disproportionate, one-sided, and do not acknowledge that all parties to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict share responsibility for ending it.

During 2024, the General Assembly considered 16 Israel-related resolutions and adopted all of them. Of these 16 resolutions, 15 resolutions were adopted by roll call vote. One was adopted by consensus. The United States voted against 13 of these resolutions, and Israel voted against all those not adopted by consensus. On the remaining two, the United States abstained once and voted yes once. Of 193 UN members, 34 voted against at least one Israel-related resolution, 15 more than in 2023. Eighteen countries (Albania, Argentina, Bulgaria, Comoros, Denmark, Estonia, Germany, Greece, Italy, Lithuania, Malawi, Malta, Netherlands, Romania, Slovakia, Sweden, Switzerland, and Tuvalu) joined the list of countries that voted against at least one Israel-related resolution, while three (Guatemala, Marshall Islands, and Micronesia) dropped off this list. In 2024, 12 percent of Israeli-Palestinian roll call votes were abstentions. This was a 2 percent decrease from 2023. Eighty-nine countries abstained on Israel-related resolutions at least once in 2024 compared to 96 countries in 2023.

GENERAL ASSEMBLY: REGIONAL GROUPS

Originally, UN Member States were unofficially grouped into five geopolitical regional groups. What began as an informal means of sharing the distribution of posts for General Assembly committees has taken on a much more expansive role. Depending on the UN context, regional groups may control elections to UN-related positions based on geographic representation, as well as coordinate substantive policy and form common fronts for negotiations and voting.
