FACT SHEET UPDATE ON ROADMAP VIOLATIONS AFTER ANNAPOLIS May 2009

Since the Annapolis Conference on 27 November 2007, Israel has failed to implement <u>any</u> of its Road Map obligations. Indeed, virtually every indicator of settlement activity shows that Israel has <u>accelerated</u> its settlement activity in the period after Annapolis.
