Assumptions: (i) no Israeli policy change on sett activity in EJ, (ii) no new construction starts in the rest of the WB in 2010 and 2011, (iii) 3,492 units under active construction at the end of 2009 (3,000 units, projected from the most recent publicly available data on active construction, plus 492 units approved by the Israeli Ministry of Defense in September). Pop. figures for 2009 and for EJ in 2010 and 2011 are projections based on trends in previous years. Pop. figures for rest of the WB in 2010 and 2011 are projections based on the fact that 1,302 housing units are currently under various stages of development in setts (not counting EJ setts) and on the above assumptions. NOTE: This paper does not constitute or imply acceptance of any arrangement short of a comprehensive and genuine sett freeze.
