This Israeli- Arab conflict stands in the center of this course. Questions of history, identity, conflict, and co-existence are explored through documentary and fiction films.

In particular, we will be looking at how the unique resources of the film/video medium can be used to express ideas, bridge conflicts, portray differing points of view, and persuade. Students complete several short papers and a final research paper or creative project.

Expectations:

A seminar is based on the active participation of its members. You will be regularly assigned to make oral presentations of assigned readings for the purpose of stimulating discussion, as well as to prepare handouts on films and readings. In addition to these weekly assignments, you will be asked to produce 1 short paper (4-5 pages) based on your reactions to the films, readings, or outside events (topics will be suggested, but open topics are welcome as well). The final project (8-10 pages or equivalent) should be based on a topic that you have decided to research further as a result of your involvement in the course, or could take the form of a creative project.

Attendance and class participation are essential in this seminar setting, and written explanations for each missed class are required. Grades will be computed as follows: Class discussion and participation 25%, Presentation 25%, short papers 20%, final project 30%.
