Course Description

This course will explore the impact of the Holocaust on Israeli society and its leadership from the end of World Word II and the formative years of the State of Israel until recently. It will examine how the memory of the Holocaust became a central component in Israeli national identity. The following issues, among others, will be discussed: the encounter between Israelis and survivors of the Holocaust, the public debate over questions of resistance and collaboration; commemoration and museums; the Kasztner Trial" and the Eichmann Trial"; relations with Germany; the impact of the Arab-Israeli conflict on Holocaust awareness; and youth trips to Poland.
